Lummi Island Heritage Trust - Spring Updates

May has In the month of June, islanders can catch glimpses of Western Columbine (*Aquilegia formosa*) and Nodding Onion (*Allium cernuum*) in bloom; wildflowers that demonstrate the striking beauty of the unique flora thriving in our local ecosystems. Western columbine, which can be found blooming in the Aiston and Baker Preserves, boasts two-tone flowers of bright red and yellow that attract hummingbirds and various pollinators. Nodding Onion, prevalent in upper reaches of the Baker Preserve and on headlands around the island, displays clusters of pale pink-purple blossoms that 'nod' gently in the breeze, attracting bees and butterflies. Nodding Onion holds particular significance as a First Food for Coast Salish People, utilized both as a vegetable and for flavoring other foods. As these native species flourish, they remind us of the importance of preserving our unique ecosystems, in honor of both the wildlife and ways of life which they support.

Things are literally abuzz here at the Otto Preserve, where the hum of native pollinators on the huckleberry blossoms outside our windows is hard to ignore! LIHT celebrates our island's bees and flowering plants this Spring and Summer with two more installments of our four-part *Native Plants and Native Pollinators* speaker series. On Thursday June 12th we look forward to *Bumble Bees: From Subalpine Meadows to Lowland Habitats*, an in-person and virtual presentation by Dr. Jim Davis of the Shuksan Conservancy. Later this month we will be wrapping up our lecture series with *The Beauty in Biodiversity: Gardening with Pacific Northwest Native Plants* on Thursday June 19th, a virtual-only presentation with Kristin Currin, author of *The Pacific Northwest Native Plant Primer*. Our hope is that LIHT's educational events will spark interest and delight in each of our 'personal preserves' — our own backyards — bringing the mission of conservation home!

On June 18th LIHT is partnering with sommelier-extraordinaire and self-described "wine sourcerer" Steven Brown, for *Wine in Full Bloom*, a wine tasting event and fundraiser at Full Bloom Farm in support of LIHT.

Since my last article we have made a lot of progress in implementing the LI Health & Wellness Program. Here are some highlights:

Program Coordinator Hired – after a very competitive search process with three final candidates, all Islanders, the board of directors chose Judy Olsen to lead our programs. Judy brings a strong background and experience in health care, business development and management. And most importantly she understands the Island culture and the needs and interests of us Islanders. For now Judy is working on a limited schedule until she heals an injured ankle and then will go to half-time later. Yay!

Telehealth Service Coming Soon – Are you an Island resident who would like to use virtual health care provider appointments when appropriate rather than make a trip to town? Do you need assistance to do this in the form of a computer, an internet connection, or assistance with navigating on-line health services. We would like to hear from you and learn how we can assist you with this process. Send an email to judyolsen.lihw@gmail.com.

New Grant Awarded – We just received a \$2,500 grant from AARP for their national Challenge Grant Program. The award is for us to set up workshops for Islanders on **Home Modifications** for safety purposes. We will offer these workshops later this summer and fall providing samples of safety equipment and engaging volunteers to help install items.

Wellness Classes Coming Soon– Our team is identifying instructors to offer wellness classes at the Gathering Place, including Yoga, Tai Chi and other fitness offerings along with an assortment of classes that the Y of Bellingham is willing to provide for us. We anticipate classes beginning in late June after a publicity campaign is launched. Look for our LIH&W table at the Saturday Market and for postings on Next Door, flyers in public spaces and social media messaging.

Foot Care Service Inaugurated – Our first Foot Care services were provided on May 22 at the Health & Wellness Resource Center on the east side of the Gathering Place. See article below from Jane Phillips. A great success!

Communicating with Islanders - Keeping the community informed of plans for classes, events, workshops etc. is key to a successful program. We plan to utilize: The Tome, Next Door, Brown Betty, printed flyers, and the Saturday Market. LIH&W currently has a page on ourlummiisland.org website and work is underway to expand this

Gym Space Needed – One initiative we are beginning to think about is having a small gym/workout space that would be available to all Islanders. A person credentialed as a fitness trainer is offering to set up her equipment in stations similar to the Curves model. As school districts across Washington face tough financial decisions due to ongoing budget cuts, communities like ours are beginning to feel the effects firsthand. The Ferndale School District, along with many others, is grappling with a significant budget deficit. In response, the District has made reductions at all levels — from administrative staff to classroom educators — to manage these financial challenges. One impact of these cuts is the loss of a teaching position at Beach Elementary next year, due in part to lower anticipated enrollment.


This news has prompted a strong and heartfelt response from our community. Lummi Island Foundation for Education (L.I.F.E.) and Beach Elementary PTO (BEPTO) have stepped up to launch a fundraising campaign with the goal of raising \$125,000 by August 1. These funds would go directly toward retaining our teacher by covering salary, insurance, and retirement benefits. While the long-term outlook is still uncertain, we are also exploring creative solutions to help stabilize and grow enrollment at Beach Elementary in the future.

Whatcom Ferry Advisory Committee

Our The Whatcom Chief has returned from a successful "in water" Dry Dock yearly maintenance session and is back in service. Kudos to our intrepid crew who performed all types of maintenance, crewed the passenger service vessel and drove the shuttle, all to help Islanders maintain ability to access the mainland!! We are tremendously grateful to our excellent crew and the Public Works dept.

At the May 13th County Council meeting the Council unanimously passed a motion to allow the Public Works dept. to borrow from other County funds so that the Beach Ave. road wash out area could be repaired this summer! Great news for Local Beach Ave. homeowners and for access to the lower LIHT Aiston Preserve.

Latest Fares news is that the County Council sent a resolution to the County Executive. "The council affirms the need to increase ferry fares to address solvency issues and ensure that fare box revenues are meeting the required 55% fare box recovery rate per WCC 10.34.03 and pursue other revenue options for the ferry fund. Further, the Council encourages the County Executive to increase ferry fares immediately to ensure solvency of the Ferry system annual operations, provided the rate increase is ample enough to meet the goals set forth in the code for fare box recovery and reserve fund contributions." This will likely result in fares increase in the near future. Consider this when purchasing new tickets.

A second resolution requested "Motion to request that the Whatcom County Ferry Advisory Committee make recommendations to County Council and the County Executive to address the annual gap in funding ferry operations." We will be discussing this at our May 28th WCFAC meeting. Look for the minutes on the Whatcom County Ferry Advisory Committee site.

At the June 10th County Council Meeting, Public Works will deliver their Ferry System Financial report to the County Council. This report will likely have future impact to ferry fares and operations. There will be a remote zoom link at the Whatcom County Council site for this meeting. You must sign up before the meeting for the zoom link.


