#### **Whatcom Ferry Advisory Committee**

Despite our recent sobering fare hike, we do have some good news to share. Our Raise Grant request for change of scope from the Federal Dept. of Transportation was approved to go forward. It is for 25 million dollars. Public works applied for a change of scope from our prior application. This happened after an excellent presentation by the Ferry & Docks subcommittee. Their presentation to Council Reps & Public Works pointing out that a smaller boat would:

- 1. Fit in existing docks;
- 2. Cost less;
- 3. Wreak less havoc on delicate costal ecology; and,
- 4. Be more climate friendly by not tearing down and replacing the existing dock well before its lifespan was complete.

Following the presentation Public Works and Council Reps agreed to reapply for a change of scope to our original Raise Grant. It has been tense the last few months as we all waited to hear from DOT. But in early September Whatcom County was informed the change of scope was approved!!!!!

In October Public Works will attend the WCFAC meeting with lots of news for islanders. They have made progress on the Island side ferry terminal and vessel designs and would like to share them. They also plan to inform ferry riders of the planned construction schedule and the expected Chief outages associated with island side dolphin replacement in Fall 2027 and 2028. This is going to require significant planning from all aspects of our island community.

**Beach School** 



#### **Lummi Island Heritage Trust** - October Greetings

We have some good news regarding Beach Avenue! The road has been repaired and the access to lower Aiston Preserve is restored. The final tasks of paving and landscaping are slated for completion by early October.

Please join us on October 18th, 9:30am-12:30pm for our annual Mushroom Foray, a fun and educational expedition for all ages. Led by renowned mycologist Dr. Fred Rhoades and other esteemed experts, four groups will explore one of each of our preserves to identify and learn about local mushroom species. This is a fantastic—and free—opportunity to deepen your knowledge of the fungal kingdom with guidance from specialists in the field. We will gather at the Otto Preserve Resource Center. Species identification and light refreshments to follow. Space is limited for this popular event, so be sure to visit <a href="https://www.liht.org">www.liht.org</a> to reserve your spot.

The results from our ongoing Trail Usage and Accessibility Survey are currently under review. We greatly appreciate your insight, suggestions and feedback and look forward to improving your experience while visiting our preserves. If you have yet to fill out the brief survey, please use the QR code provided on the mushroom image to get started. You may also find survey instruction on our website under "Get Involved". Thank you for taking the time to join this important conversation!

As the days shorten, take a moment to consider the seasonal activity of harvestmen, arachnids of the order Opiliones. Routinely mistaken for spiders, which have two distinct body segments and often multiple eyes, these "daddy long legs" possess a fused, single-unit body and typically two eyes, located on a central mound. Harvestmen are essentially harmless to humans; they have no venom glands and do not spin webs. These industrious omnivores are nature's cleanup crew, happily consuming a varied diet of decaying vegetation, fungus, carrion, and garden pests such as aphids. Their evolutionary track record is impressive, with ancestors having crawled around for over 400 million years, predating the dinosaurs. This long run may be attributed to defense mechanisms and adaptations such as releasing a foul-smelling odor or shedding a leg when disturbed. The detached leg can continue to twitch for some time, distracting a predator and allowing the harvestman to make a clean getaway. With over 6,600 species identified globally and an estimated 10,000 or more awaiting discovery, there is still much to learn about the quirky, ancient, and charming harvestmen. These unsung arachnids are a gentle reminder of the miniature marvels that enrich the season. Happy Halloween! ^^ö^^

#### Halloween Zombies:


- Fake spider webs are dangerous to bats and owls. Hang it inside the house.

Joe and I were both born and raised here and are each 5th generation islanders, and we truly love this community. We purchased The Islander Store in February, with a vision to turn it into a true community hub and create more opportunities for businesses to thrive right here on the island.

We were so honored when Brad and Deborah approached us about purchasing the store. We've known them since we were babies and love them dearly. They continue to operate The Islander Store until they retire, and they have done the island such a service by running the only grocery store here for around 40 years, which is no easy feat. You can tell when talking to Brad and Deb that everything they do is to serve the island community and that they deeply care, and we hope to do the same, carrying on their legacy and creating something they are proud of. It's so important for islanders to support the grocery store so it can remain open and continue being the lifeline that it has always been.

Part of our vision is revitalizing the old building itself. It's a landmark with so much history, and while it needs some updates, we're committed to preserving its original charm and character. We've updated the exterior with a beautiful jewel-toned green paint and a new Islander sign. We wanted to make sure the sign proudly says Est. 1973, honoring the year when Rich and Lylene Johnson first made the space into a grocery store. Joe and Duncan McLane also created an amazing front door for The Galley that opens vertically, adding a fun ambiance for indoor/outdoor dining. We also love the old driftwood sign, it had started to fall apart, but Joe was able to carefully save it and mount it inside the store so its history could continue to be part of the space.

Michael Godshall helped us paint a fun mural on the north side of the store. Next spring, some island artists will be joining us to bring it even more to life by filling the letters with illustrations of Lummi Island's native flora and fauna. The right side of the mural will feature reefnet gear and fisherman, honoring the island's fishing heritage.

Beyond the building itself, Robyn LaRue and I have been working together on landscaping projects around the store. We planted lots of dahlias and created beautiful planters to add more color and flowers around the property. It's already made the space feel more alive, and we're excited to expand our projects even further next spring.

We're also working closely with Simon Lapof and Rianna Godshall, who will be taking over The Islander Store business when Brad and Deborah retire. Together, we're hoping to expand what the store can offer by sourcing more locally farmed, caught, and raised foods from both Lummi Island and Whatcom County. Supporting our local food system is important to us, and we see The Islander as a natural place to connect producers with the community.

Alongside these efforts, we're thrilled to see so many new and exciting businesses springing up on the property, alongside some beloved longtime favorites:

- The Galley Restaurant Opened by Simon Lapof and Rianna Godshall, serving pressed sandwiches, soup, and beer and wine on tap. Their goal is to be a gathering place for islanders. They plan to be open year round with an evolving menu.
- **Bock's Box** Tara Bock has moved her coffee trailer here, serving amazing espresso, beverages, and pastries.
- The Ghost Kitchen Operated by Robert Keller, offering a variety of creative, rotating menu items.
- The Reefnetter Kevin is still serving his fish and chips, a local staple.
- Sister's Bountiful Mercantile Robyn LaRue continues to run her wonderful gift shop, now located on the north side of the interior of The Islander. This is a spot where many local artists and makers sell their goods.
- Seas The Day Rentals & Stay & Sea Michael Godshall has launched a kayak, paddle board, and bike rental
  shop that's already become a hit with locals and visitors alike. Ashley(my twin sister) and I will also be sharing
  the space with Michael Godshall's rental company. Together, we'll be calling this shared space "The Shanty." It
  will serve as both a welcome center for island visitors and as the office for our Stay & Sea vacation rental
  business.
- **Saturday Market** Still hosted in the field north of The Islander from May through September, bringing together local growers, makers, and artisans.

Looking ahead, we have some exciting plans for the property. We're working toward installing a new commercial septic system, which will allow us to expand what's possible on-site. Alongside that, we hope to build a commercial kitchen so that more types of food can be prepared and served locally. These would include hot food items, deli items, etc. Another dream of ours is to add a community event stage in the field on the south side of the store, something that could host live music, gatherings, and other events that celebrate island life. It's been incredible to watch the energy return to this property. The Islander feels alive again, with both new businesses and longtime favorites contributing to a true gathering place for our community. We're so grateful for the chance to be part of this transformation and are excited about what's still to come.

There is quite a shortage of blood right now, especially type "O" blood, so every pint is very valuable to its recipients of all blood types. While donating you may feel a quick pinch or sting at first when the needle is inserted, but donating blood should be painless overall. And, think of the life you are saving! Plus, you get a miniphysical exam for free! A professional blood collection staff member conducts a medical history interview and a brief health check of your blood pressure, temperature, pulse, and iron level. What a bonus!


